

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium was introduced by the government in April 2011. The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools on the basis of the number of children from low income families who are eligible for FSM and children who have been looked after (in the care of the local authority) continuously for more than six months.

2015-2016

In the financial year 2015.16, the level of pupil premium was £1,320 per pupil. Our Lady & St. Edward's Primary School received a provisional allocation of £9,240. The funds were allocated as follows:

1:1 tuition , Staff training (TA) , Support for educational visits and resources , Small Group tuition Lunchtime support

Impact

- In 2015/16 5.2% of our pupils were eligible to receive pupil premium funding.
- In KS2, 1/2 children eligible to receive FSM achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- There was only one child eligible for FSM in KS1. Although this child did not meet expected standards, significant progress was made in all areas of learning.
- 100% of pupil premium children met the expected standard in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check.
- 1 pupil eligible for pupil premium children did not achieve GLD at the end of EYFS.

2016-2017

In the current financial year, 2016/17, the level of pupil premium was £1,320 per pupil. Our Lady & St Edward's Primary School has received a provisional allocation of £13,560. In 2016/17 5.6% of our pupil were eligible for Pupil premium funding. The planned expenditure is as follows;

- Learning Mentor
- Booster support for Year 2 and 6 pupils.
- Small group and 1:1 tuition
- Curriculum enrichment
- Educational Visits
- Staff training

- In KS2, 2/4 children eligible to receive FSM did not achieve the expected standard in Reading, Writing. GPS and Maths they both received SEN support. 2/4 of the pupils met the standard in reading and writing, 2/4 were above for maths.
- There were 2 children eligible for FSM in KS1. 2 of the pupils did not meet the reading standard, 1/2 met the writing standard, 1/2 was below for maths and 1/2 above for maths.
- 100% of pupil premium children met the expected standard in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check.
- 1 pupil eligible for pupil premium children achieved GLD at the end of EYFS and was exceeding in all areas.

2017-2018

In the current financial year, 2017/18, the level of pupil premium was £1,320 per pupil. Our Lady & St Edward's Primary School has received a provisional allocation of £16,420. In 2017-18 5.6% of the school were eligible for funding. The planned expenditure is as follows;

- Learning Mentor
- Booster support for Year 2 and 6 pupils.
- Small group and 1:1 tuition
- Support for extra-curricular activities
- Educational Visits
- Staff training
- Lunchtime support

- 1 pupil eligible for pupil premium children achieved GLD at the end of EYFS and was at the expected standard in all areas.
- 100% of pupil premium children met the expected standard in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check.
- There was 1 pupil eligible at KS1 who met all standards at the end of KS1
- At the end of KS2 the 1 pupil eligible did not meet the expected standard

- The Learning Mentor provided support for emotional and behavioural needs. As a result there were fewer reported incidents of behavioural issues.
- Support was provided for extra-curricular activities and educational visits this also included the residential visit. Music tuition was also provided.
- Training was provided for TA to enable them to further understand their role.
- Additional lunchtime support provides support for pupils to engage and co-operate with others
