


# Reception Newsletter 7<sup>th</sup> October 2021



This week has been a shorter week but we have still been very busy. We have been very impressed with how sensible Reception have been walking into school this week. They look very grown up! This week we have had a themed week looking at the story of "The Little Red Hen".

Here are just a few of the things we have done this week:

- The children have listened to the story of "The Little Red Hen" and orally retold the story using actions.
- The children enjoyed making their own bread which smelt delicious. I hope it tasted as good as it smelled!
- The children enjoyed tasting a range of different bread. They tried white bread, brown bread, baguettes and pitta bread.
- The children also made their own toast and ate it during snack time.
- The children have sequenced the story of "The Little Red Hen".
- The children have been looking at making patterns. We have made our own sound patterns, physical patterns and Little Red Hen patterns.
- The children have learnt two new sounds this week in phonics - n and m.
- The children have continued thinking about God's Creation and learnt that it is our responsibility to look after the world. We have been thinking of some of the different ways we can take care of the world.
- The children have been making scarecrow pictures out of collage.
- The children have been on a Nature Walk around the school field and looked at how we are starting to see signs of Autumn. We also had a treasure hunt looking for conkers whilst we explored our school grounds.
- The children have been practicing their jumping in PE.
